


Current issues in the LGPS

Despite the summer holiday period, it's been a busy month following the General Election result. Happy reading!

Election and new government special

Pensions and the LGPS has been in the spotlight in the first month of the new Labour government. We've summarised the activity below:

The King's Speech

There was no explicit mention of the LGPS in the King's Speech on 17 July but the below areas were of note:

- National Wealth Fund Bill central to the new Government's mission to deliver growth and a greener economy. Mentions the £7.3bn capital injection although no specific reference to where it's coming from, other than a nod to the UK Infrastructure Bank.
- Pension Schemes Bill the role of pension schemes supporting the UK economy, with measures in the Bill to 'enable consolidation and more productive investment of funds'. No mention of LGPS fund/pool mergers but instead focuses on private pensions market consolidation, including commercial Superfunds for closed legacy DB schemes.
- Draft Audit Reform and Corporate Governance Bill FRC is being replaced by a new regulator called the Audit, Reporting and Governance Authority, with a regime to oversee the audit market.

Pension and retirement savings review

A joint press release continued the agenda of previous government on productive finance and pooling, including Rachel Reeves reiterating her commitment to see all listed LGPS assets pooled by March 2025 (a deadline set by the previous government).

It's also pleasing to see a commitment to undertake an in-government pension and retirement savings review, and that the review will work with the new Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) Minister, Jim McMahon. The first stage of the review will "examine actions to support greater productive investment and better retirement outcomes, including through further consolidation and encouraging at-scale





schemes to increase returns through broader investment strategies". The first stage of the review will report "in the next few months".

Ministerial appointments and the return of MHCLG

A summary of key ministerial appoints most notable for the LGPS include:

- Angela Rayner MP as Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities.
- Rachel Reeves MP as Chancellor of the Exchequer.
- Emma Reynolds MP as a Parliamentary Secretary in His Majesty's Treasury and the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) (the first joint ministerial role across both the DWP and HM Treasury).
- Jim McMahon MP as a Minister of State in the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC).

Appointments were closely followed by the announcement of DLUHC returning to its former name, MHCLG.

Piecing it all together

It's been a busy LGPS regulatory and policy year since the "Mansion House" speech last year. To help summarise and bring you up to today's position, we've prepared a summary note. Over the coming weeks we will provide further insight on specific policy areas and comments on emerging information.

National Knowledge Assessment 2024

In mid-September we'll be launching our National Knowledge Assessment (NKA). This online assessment for Committee and Board members has been designed to measure both individual and collective knowledge levels across 8 key topics, as well as complementing Hymans' LGPS Online Learning Academy.

The purpose of the NKA is to check on how knowledge levels are progressing, see if the focus of your next year's training plan feels right, to measure engagement and to provide Funds with a tangible way to demonstrate they're regularly assessing committee and Board members knowledge levels and training needs, in line with the Pensions Regulator's expectations. Over the first half of 2024, Club Vita hosted a series of webinars entitled "The Risk of Living Longer". Chaired by friend of Club Vita, Uli Stengele (Nationwide Financial) and Club Vita's Douglas Anderson, the series featured a range of industry experts all exploring different areas contributing to the possibility of significant extensions to future lifespan or health span. Virgin Media / Section 37 legal case

Where specific actuarial 'section 37' certificates cannot be found, the June 2023 legal ruling has the potential to invalidate historic scheme benefit changes dating all the way back to 1997. Pension practitioners were awaiting the outcome of an appeal, but this has now (July 2024) been dismissed by the Court of Appeal and the original ruling stands.

LGPS practitioners are not currently making additional liability allowances within funding and accounting valuations, as there is significant uncertainty about whether this ruling will impact the LGPS. We understand HM Treasury are currently looking into whether section 37 certificates exist for prior LGPS benefit changes, and pension bodies have written to DWP to ask for a pragmatic solution (eg legislation that would allow retrospective section 37 certificates to be produced now to validate historic changes). In brief...

Inflation figures

The latest ONS figures recorded annual CPI for the year to June 2024 at 2.0%, which was unchanged compared to the prior month. RPI for the same period was 2.9%.

Digital administration

The Pensions Administration Standards Association (PASA) has published a white paper with commentary about pension schemes' penetration into digital administration.

Updated actuarial guidance

MHCLG (or DLUHC in old money!) has issued updated guidance on individual transfers, pension debits (post April 2014) and CETVs on divorce, and a new guidance note on applying the McCloud remedy to retrospective cases.

New government

The English & Welsh SAB held a webinar on 10 July to discuss what impact the new government might have on the LGPS. The recording is available here.

Minimum pension age (MPA)

The House of Commons Library's updated briefing paper considers the rules and measures around the move in the MPA from age 55 to age 57 in 2028.

Budget date

Chancellor of the Exchequer, Rachel Reeves, will deliver her first Budget on 30 October 2024.

Nature-related disclosures

The Taskforce on Nature-related Financial Disclosures (TFND) and Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) have teamed up to produce a mapping tool that aligns TFND recommendations and metrics with GRI standards.

ESG report

The Pensions Regulator (TPR) has published a review of how pension schemes are complying with their ESG duties, including climate change.

TPO corporate plan

The Pensions Ombudsman (TPO) has published its corporate plan for 2024/25. It includes plans to reduce waiting times and build up expertise.

2020 cost cap valuation (England & Wales)

The SAB has decided against recommending scheme changes based on GAD's assessment of costs at 20.5% of pensionable pay (1% above the target overall cost). Its letter also implores Central Government practices on funding local authority obligations toward the LGPS to fully abide by the 'New Burdens Doctrine'.

Pensions dashboards

LGA have published - here for England & Wales or here for Scotland - first versions of the LGPS Pensions Dashboards Connection Guide and the AVCs and Pensions Dashboards Administrator Guide.



Gender pension gap

The House of Commons Library's updated briefing paper outlines progress to address the gender pensions gap, and proposals for reform.
